



LATAZ RESEARCH AND PUBLISHING POLICY

Before any article, research paper or piece is published on behalf of LATAZ or one of its SIGs, online or in print, the nominated person, or people with responsibility for that publication or website should ensure the following requirements are met:

1. All contributors should be correctly acknowledged. Any contributors' biodata and email should be included, as well as a photo if required by the publication, with the permission of the author.
2. The correct ISSN/ISBN should be included, where relevant.
3. Any relevant copyright permission should be obtained for both images and text – the Professional Authors guidelines on copyright should be consulted in case of outstanding questions.
4. Publications should include a copyright notice stating: **LATAZ retains the right to reproduce part or all of a publication in other publications, including retail editions**. Contributions to a publication remain the intellectual property of the authors. Any requests to reproduce a particular article should be sent to the relevant contributor and LATAZ. Articles which have first appeared in LATAZ publications must acknowledge the LATAZ publication as the original source of the article if reprinted elsewhere.
5. All quotes must be attributed, and full references given.
6. The contents of the publication should not be offensive or attempt to incite prejudice or hatred of any kind. They should conform to LATAZ's mission, goals and practices concerning discrimination, respect and fair treatment.
7. The contents of the publication should not have, as the sole or main aim, the objective of promoting a publication, product, service or business. It should be relevant to the interests of LATAZ members and not be solely commercial.
8. Whilst critical debate is encouraged, contributions should not defame the work of a fellow professional.
9. LATAZ branding should be included in the publication, as well as LATAZ information and advertising wherever appropriate and where space allows.



10. Advertising of materials within a publication or newsletter should only be for materials for which the author has already signed off on permission for the material to be published and sold.
11. Thought should be given to making the publication accessible for people with reading disabilities.

For all accepted articles and research papers for publication:

- LATAZ reserves the right to make minor editorial changes should they be deemed necessary by the editorial team.
- LATAZ retains the right to republish any publications or to make them available in electronic form for the benefit of its members.
